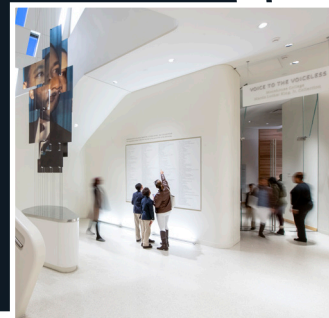
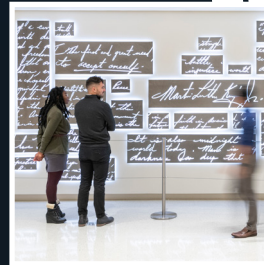
The Paula Scher mural in the main lobby features protest posters from across the globe.

“Spark of Conviction” tells the stories of courageous human rights defenders and the struggle for rights and freedom around the world today. This floor also contains “Requiem,” the last part of the U.S. Civil Rights gallery and the Shared Accomplishments rotunda—videos of activists throughout history. The mezzanine often hosts temporary exhibits.
